### **Youth Services**

UBU New Projects National Launch 2021 (new UBU Your Place Your Space Services) Minister for DCEDIY is launching the 2021 UBU New Services on Wednesday 27 July 2022 at the Townhall Room, DCEDIY Building, Dublin. Young people, staff from the new Foróige UBU Service in Portlaoise, and LOETB representatives will attend.

# **LCYP Update**

Crinniú na nÓg: 21 June, with support from Creative Ireland Laois. LCYP enabled young people from Midlands Down syndrome to work with Paul Timoney specialist artist in the Dunamaise Arts Centre. In celebration of Crinniú na nÓg, the LCYP made available to Makerspace Portarlington 8 Oculus Virtual Reality Headsets so that young people could try the latest rift headsets and understand how technology works.

Two Family Resource Centres in Laois and two in Offaly are carrying out extra creative activities as part of Summer Camp with funding through LO LCYP.

The PPAI photographer of the year 2021 & 2022 James Crombie is working with young people who are part of Offaly Down Syndrome association. The aim of the project is to show through photography that the members are regular members of society who have the same rights and abilities as everyone else.

Young people under the Young Adult Mental Health Service have taking part in creative taster programmes in ceramics and a sensory art experience under the supervision of their Occupational Therapist.

Children from CAMHS – the Child and Mental Health Services – are engaging in a programme called Living My Best Life supported through storytelling & future vision storyboards. Under the supervision of the Senior Occupational Therapist.

July is Traveller Pride month with events organised by Youth Work Ireland Midlands Offaly Traveller Movement, Laois Traveller Action Group. Creative activities and engagement funded through LO LCYP

Youth Diversion Project - Sub Project in Birr delivering a STEM Summer Programme in Kilcormac targeting rural young people.

Mountmellick FEC creating a Mosaic piece for the sensory garden supported by LCYP & Arts Office Laois.

Children & young people within the Laois Domestic Abuse Services are putting together a zine or book based on their experiences of witnessing domestic abuse and violence. This will be under the supervision of the Child and Youth Development worker.

Forrest Festival Emo – again the VR Oculus headsets will be on loan to Makerspace helping young people understand how technology work. This will form part of the Youth Village within the festival.

# **Music Generation**

Laois-Franklin partnership: Eight young musicians and 3 adults from Franklin, Tennessee were hosted by MG Laois and Laois School of Music from 18-20 June 2022; events included a gala concert with special guest Steve Cooney in The Malthouse, Stradbally.

Ireland Funds Conference, Killarney: The MG Laois Trad Orchestra performed with MG Waterford, at a gala dinner in Killarney on Thursday 16 June, alongside Sharon Shannon and for an audience that included Adam Clayton of U2.

MG Laois Musician Educator Dale McKay travelled to Newcastle on a site visit to observe the work of Musician, Rob Kitchen, supported by the Music Generation/ Arts Council Partnership Creativity and Collaboration Fund.

MG Laois hosted a Youth Music Gathering on Sunday 26 June as part of the Old Fort Quarter Festival, featuring rock and pop bands from all over Ireland, funded by the Music Generation/ Arts Council Partnership Creativity and Collaboration Fund.

Two Summer Schools took place in June/July, a 2-week Summer School of Rock and Pop, and a 3-day Trad Summer School.

Large scale renovation works have commenced in Laois Music Centre (June 2022).

Nine musicians from MG Laois travelled to France to take part in the Breizh Pan Celtic Festival in Tremélin, Brittany (5 July-11 July).

# **Expansion of facilities at NCTC, Mount Lucas**

LOETB welcomed Minister Simon Harris to the National Construction Training Centre at Mount Lucas on Monday 18 July. Minister Harris was on site to make a number of announcements relating to provision at Mount Lucas:

1. Mount Lucas has been selected as the site for the National Modern Methods of Construction (MMC) Demonstration Park. The Governments Housing for All (HfA) Strategy provides a commitment to promoting a culture of compliant, good quality sustainable innovation in residential construction through development of Modern Methods of Construction (MMC).

HfA sets out a number of measures which will support and promote the development of MMC in Ireland, including the establishment of a National Demonstration Park for MMC. The MMC Demonstration Park will be an accessible and interactive built resource for applied research, training and demonstration.

Phase One of the Demonstration Park will consist of a street of 10 building 'pads' with additional space available for future development. An Open competition will be held inviting Construction companies to build on the pads exhibiting the latest construction technologies and innovative methods in residential construction.

2. Minister Harris officially launched the new QQI Level 5 Scaffolding Apprenticeship and opened the new Scaffolding training unit on site. The new apprenticeship is a two-year programme with 2 x 10 weeks blocks of off the job training with the remainder used for onsite experience.

The aim of the Apprenticeship is to provide a National standard for the Construction Industry, Improve Health and Safety and recognise Scaffolding as a craft. Modules cover all elements of Scaffolding from design to dismantling. Elements included range from BIM for Scaffolders to Toolbox talks and working on Complex structures

3. LOETB FET Service has been approved for the expansion of existing Mount Lucas facilities under DFHERIS new Strategic Infrastructure Upgrade Fund (SIUF). LOETB is the first ETB in the country to receive this funding, and it will provide for a doubling of capacity in NZEB/Retrofit provision (2000 to 4000 places annually) and provide new programmes in Modern Methods of Construction including site simulation, BIM, Modelling, Passive House and Modular Installation.

These announcements represent a significant investment in the region and place the National Construction Training Centre at Mount Lucas firmly at the centre of the national skills strategy for construction. Minister Harris was joined by members of the SOLAS team, the National Apprenticeship Office, CIF, Board members and local representatives.

# **LOETB National Programme Development**

LOETB FET Services are currently developing a number of National programmes on behalf of SOLAS. These include:

Green (Nature) SafePass: The course is aimed at:

- Contractors who undertake works in and around sensitive environments (SAC, SPA, NHA)

- Managers in State Agencies and Local Authorities who design tenders and procurement processes for works on such sites
- The course will set out the legal requirements for works in a sensitive environment, explore pragmatic solutions to common challenges and raise awareness of best practice for the protection and enhancement of biodiversity.

Blue Cert (ISME): ISME and other trade associations have identified key skills and learning gaps within the small enterprise sector.

- Essential components of company, employment, taxation and commercial law.
- Adjustment to and exploitation of the low-carbon economy.
- Adoption to the digital economy, technology absorption and software packages.
- Lean sigma tools for manufacturing and services.
- Market Research and Marketing skills.
- Financial management and treasury skills.
- Research and Development, innovation, and the protection of intellectual property.
- Leadership and development.

Retrofit Programmes: LOETB and TUS are collaboratively developing a suite of programmes to meet the needs of new entrants to the Construction sector, and to provide a clear pathway for new and current employees in the sector. These programmes range from introductory courses at QQI Levels 4 and 5 to co-developed and co-delivered Special Purpose Awards at Level 6. These Level 6 'micro-credentials' will allow learners to build credits towards a Retrofit Co-ordinator award at Level 7 and a Retrofit Manager award at Level 8. These Level 6 Special Purpose Awards are the first example in the country of an ETB and a TU co-developing and co-delivering programmes. It is our intention to replicate this model across other disciplines within our portfolio of courses. Other partners involved in this collaboration include CIF, SEAI, NSAI and the HSA.
