10.Chief Executive's Report

Schools Directorate

SEN Provision Mapping: ETBI Provision Mapping Showcase

The ETBI Provision Mapping Showcase event took place on 16 April 2024. It involved schools presenting their approaches to aspects of the provision mapping process and fostering an environment of shared learning and collaboration. Two LOETB schools, Coláiste Naomh Cormac and Tullamore College contributed poster presentations on their engagement with the Provision Mapping Process. The Inclusion Co-ordinator, Josephine Moore contributed a poster on the development of Communities of Practice within LOETB.

Ethos/Identity Multi-Beliefs and Values (IMBV) Education

In-person CPD for teachers of IMBV and teachers new to the specification was facilitated in ETBI Naas on 9 April and Kilkenny Education Centre on 25 April. Online Information sessions for Principals and Deputy Principals on the specification took place on 19/20 February and 19/20 March.

ETBI National Ethos Lead Symposium

The Ethos Lead National Symposium took place on 22 April. This event was attended by Ethos leads from LOETB schools. The event brought together Ethos leads, educators, and

experts to share insights and best practice on creating inclusive and equitable learning environments.

Inclusion

LOETB have engaged with a Train the Trainers model with the Crisis Prevention Institute (CPI) to train nominated school staff as Instructors of the Verbal Safety Interventions and Disengagements. Each school has a certified instructor in the programme.

Community of Practice

Groups are working on Inclusion, Ethos, Digital Technology, and School Planning with involved leaders and school staff from the nine LOETB post-primary schools.

STEAM Programme

The new STEAM Programme had its showcase event recently at Portlaoise College. This was part of our ongoing partnership with Laois and Offaly County Councils that saw equipment, training, and supports provided to all our schools.

On the day, all nine schools came together to display the work that they had produced as part of the programme. As well as competing in the VEX Robotics on the day, students also showcased the work they created in the other three strands of the Programme: Podcasting, LEGO League, and Minecraft design. The podcasts were community based, with 'i-walk' audio tours of their localities, while other student teams recreated their towns and villages in Minecraft as sustainable and accessible communities. As well as the €5000 equipment and training that was supplied to each LOETB school as part of the programme, Laois and Offaly County Councils provided a prize fund of €6500. Both the formal and informal feedback on the event was very positive, with LOETB students reporting that they particularly liked seeing the work of other schools and enjoyed having their creations shown on the large screen as part of the different ceremonies on the day.

Over 200 LOETB students and 30 teachers were involved in the Programme, which was designed to offer increased opportunities in the area of STEAM to Junior Cycle students, while increasing engagement with the area of Computer Science. Currently, the plan is that the STEAM Programme - which included support from Microsoft and Createschool, as well as key partners Laois and Offaly County Councils - will continue for the school year 2024/2025.

Atlantic Technological University Computer Science Teaching

A partnership between LOETB, Offaly and Laois County Councils and Atlantic Technological University (ATU) saw teachers fully supported to complete modules of the Higher Diploma course in Computer Science teaching. So far, three LOETB teachers have completed all six modules to gain the full qualification, with the aim of either introducing the subject to their school for the first time or contributing to the teaching of Computer Science in a school where the subject is already established.

The arrangements for the course saw some modules hosted by LOETB in Tullamore and Portlaoise, with lecturers travelling from ATU, while the rest were completed online. It is hoped that the partnership will continue in the year ahead, with a new cohort recruited, while the current teachers are supported to complete further modules. The overall aim of

LOETB's leadership of the programme is to increase participation in Leaving Cert Computer Science across our schools.

Youth Services

DCEDYI has allocated €47,000 (plus an additional allocation of up to €5,000 for non-capital, once-off set-up costs in 2024) to LOETB to administer under the Targeted Youth Employability Support Initiative (TYESI) 2024. This initiative is intended to fund programmes, interventions, and actions to support young people aged 15-24 years who are not in education, employment, or training, by providing community-based interventions and support to improve their soft skills, confidence, and agency to ensure engagement by young people in progression pathways. In total, there was 1 Applicant who received an award of €47,000.

Integration Grant Supports to Ukraine (Migrant) Young People - Youth Organisation/Youth Clubs 2024

DCEDIY has allocated €75,000 to LOETB to administer under the Grant Scheme for 2024. This funding is to support local integration efforts through additional places in UBU Your Place Your Space funded organisations and existing clubs, and the formation of new clubs as appropriate.

Local Youth Club Grant Scheme 2024

DCEDIY has allocated €82,544 to LOETB to administer under Grant Scheme for 2024. The Scheme supports voluntary youth club/groups activities for young people, with priority given to clubs/groups catering for aged of 10 and 21. The primary focus of the Scheme is to assist local, volunteer-led youth clubs/groups that provide a programme of youth work activities for young people. In total there were 33 Applications, which are currently being processed. It is anticipated that awards will be made to successful applicants in late June 2024.

Local Creative Youth Partnership

Laois and Offaly Local Creative Youth Partnership (LCYP) worked closely with the Portlaoise Family Resource Centre on the introduction of Creative Pilot Initiative in the early years setting. The co-ordinator delivered training to the Early Years Staff of Portlaoise Family Resource and the artist working with them so that children and young people are given space, voice, audience, and influence to have a meaningful voice in decision-making. Consultant Katie Chapple and Local Creative Youth Partnership co-ordinator conducted Focus Groups across Laois and Offaly in person as part of the Consultation and Development for Laois and Offaly Local Creative Youth Partnership.

Taekwondo Workshops and classes were requested by Ukrainian children and young people and other young people in the Tullamore area. The Local Creative Youth Partnership are supporting these workshops and classes up to the end of the year.

The LCYP funded a 'Battle of the Trad Bands' as part of the recent Portlaoise Trad Festival. This initiative targeted 12-18-year-olds.

To celebrate Biodiversity Week, Midlands Science will deliver two workshops (one in Laois and one in Offaly) on behalf of the LCYP. The workshops will focus on Eco Soap Making.

Music Generation Offaly

Music Generation Offaly ran a very successful Easter music camp in partnership with The Academy of Music in Tullamore during the first week of the Easter school holidays. There were 2 groups in the morning session: 5–8-year-olds and 9–12-year-olds, with 15 children in each group.

Following a successful grant application from Offaly Arts Office, Music Generation Offaly was awarded funding under the Youth Arts Commission Grant to develop a songwriting project with the choir in Tullamore College, and alumni student Tolü Makay. The project is nearing completion and will finish with a recording session.

Singfest 2024 is back in TUS Athlone on Thursday 16 and Friday 17 of May and will see over 2000 primary school students from across Offaly and Westmeath take part in a series of choral workshops culminating in a "Big Sing". We are delighted to welcome Patrick Barrett from the Irish Youth Training Choir as guest conductor.

Planning is well under way for "We Are Music Generation" 10-year celebrations in Offaly: Céilúradh Mór which will bring together as many of our young musicians as possible for a Big Gig in three locations later this year.

FET Directorate

FET Strategy 2024-2027

The FET Service has commenced the development of a three-year strategy. The strategy will focus on establishing LOETB as a centre of excellence in growth sectors both nationally and regionally. The strategy will see LOETB become the lead provider in Construction,

Agriculture, and Green Skills nationally with an emphasis on programme development and Quality Assurance. The strategy will also establish visible progression pathways across the Service that are focused on employment and Higher Education in key regional sectors including IT, Bio-Pharma, Healthcare, Services and Engineering, with a further emphasis on creating alternative options for Post Primary students. Consultation has commenced with senior management and will continue with all staff in Q2 and Q3.

MMC Project Manager Apprenticeship

LOETB and Technological University Dublin (TUD) are currently building a consortium to develop a comprehensive suite of MMC programmes including a proposed national MMC Project Management Apprenticeship Programme.

The partnership is currently reaching out to industry stakeholders to participate in shaping a proposal to meet the specific needs of the Irish construction sector. That industry-led consortium will ensure the development of a suite of programmes that equip graduates with the skills and knowledge to effectively manage MMC projects and contribute to the future of the construction industry.

Meetings with industry leaders are focusing on

- The current and future industry need for MMC skills and professionals in Ireland.
- The potential structure and content of a suite of programmes at Levels 5-9 to address this need.
- Opportunities for future engagement with and participation in the consortium.

The apprenticeship will be a Level 7/8 programme in project management, with the successful candidates also successfully completing the training required for MMC operator at Level 5 of the National Qualifications Framework and MMC technician at Level 6. The form of training would be on-the-job training alternating with short modules of off-the-job training. Technology University Dublin plan to deliver the off-the-job components, while the National Construction Training Centre at Mount Lucas plan to provide specialist 'praxis' modules (e.g., Plant; specific materials).

It is planned to formally present the programme proposal to the National Apprenticeship Office in June and, on receipt of approval, to begin programme development process that aims to gain Academic Council validation within the current calendar year.

ZEB Programme Development

The National Construction Training Campus at Mount Lucas has reviewed the EPBD (Energy performance of Buildings Directive) with the aim of developing fit for purpose awards as we move toward Zero Emissions buildings based on identifying skills gaps based on emerging trends within the Construction Sector.

New courses will be delivered including:

- ZEB Principles,
- Smart Ready Buildings,
- District Heating

- Optimising Indoor environmental quality
- E-mobility.

These new courses will allow new skills sets to complement existing qualifications and professions. Courses will also be set at an introductory level for homeowners and those looking to work in the green construction sector. The courses will range from micro qualifications to feeder programmes for universities.

All courses will be aligned with Industry and the National Construction Training Campus has held initial online panel events, with representation from policymakers/statutory bodies and subject matter experts. A consortium will be set up to develop and review new courses as they enter the pilot and sign-off stage.

CAIRN Homes Rig

LOETB and Cairn Homes are working in partnership on a second mobile rig which will promote the construction industry by giving practical exposure to variety of trades including plumbing, electrical, block laying, and MMC. It will be equipped with necessary facilities and resources to support engagement and outreach in a variety of relevant settings to include, schools, career fairs, and industry events. It will also be used for onsite training and workshops on Cairn sites across the Country.

LOETB will also provide Learner Support for Apprentices working on Cairns sites. The support focuses on supporting employers to enhance retention rates in construction-related apprenticeships through the provision of the following:

a) An Educational Support Programme during Apprenticeship Phase 1 that provides apprentices with skillsets that will enhance their capacity to approach Phase 2 of the Apprenticeship Programme with confidence.

The programme will include study skills, assignment writing, project mathematics, exam preparation techniques.

b) A series of Phase 2 Technical Support Programmes that are subject specific to relevant craft apprenticeships.

FET Agriculture Strategy

A key focus of the FET agricultural strategy is the introduction of additional agricultural education through the offering of Continuous Professional Development component awards and training programmes grounded on agricultural sustainability, a key consideration for farmers and industries in our region.

Our target audience for this strategy are part time farmers. A key aim of this project is to ensure continuation of part-time farming despite off-farm income and, where possible, upskill farmers such that the off-farm income is generated within the agricultural sector. The plan is to educate farmers in the region to get the most from their parcel of land, regardless of size, while ensuring its sustainability and viability for future generations.

A key part of this strategy will be the continuation of existing partnerships with Gurteen & Mountbellew Agricultural Colleges and Teagasc while hoping to foster new partnerships with key agricultural stakeholders and higher education institutions. Using these partnerships, our intention is to roll out the strategy nationally by 2027.
