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7. CHIEF EXECUTIVES REPORT:

Education Services

Junior Cycle:

Departmental Circular 0024/2016, on Arrangements for the Implementation of the Framework for Junior Cycle with particular reference to school years 2015/16 and 2016/2017 was issued on 2 March. Schools are now planning and making arrangements for the three year programme. School principals will also be discussing the programme at their upcoming meeting to ensure a coordinated and supportive approach to implementation.

Proclamation Day Events:

All eight schools organised event for Proclamation Day on March 15th. Students read the original 1916 Proclamation as well as student's writing a new version of the proclamation in their school. A variety of history, drama musical and other events took place in the schools to mark the occasion.

Many students from the schools and Youthreach centres entered the Laois and Offaly ETB Ireland 2016 Centenary Competition. The standard was very high and it was great that we had such a large number of entries. Congratulations to the winners Grace and Verona Lynch, students from Coláiste Naomh Cormac, Kilcormac for their winning entry which was a ballad entitled, 'Uncle Jim -1916' (based on a true story). Courtney Walsh, a student from Banagher Youthreach, received a 'Highly Commended' award for her poem entitled 'Look Around'

School Fundraising Events:

On 11th March students from Portlaoise College's student council, the 5A LCVP class and 2nd Year College for Everyone Leaders organised a 5km Run/Walk in aid of the Donal Walsh Foundation. There was a great turnout on the day and the school raised €1600 for this worthy cause.

Students of Coláiste Naomh Cormac organised a very successful 5km run on February 26th. Students committed to training for a number of weeks in advance of the event. They raised €520 for Teach Fáilte, the Acquired Brain Injury clinic in Mountbolus.

School Awards

Erik Plat, a student from Portlaoise College has been recognised for his top Junior Certificate grades in Business Studies, in a recent ceremony at Maynooth University. Erik was awarded certificates by representatives of the Department of Economics, Finance and Accounting, School of Business and Department of Law.

5th Year Agricultural Science class at Coláiste Naomh Cormac have created a Multimedia Farm Safety presentation which has been selected as one of the 10 finalists in the HSA Farm Safety competition. Finals take place in Dublin Castle at the end of April.

Congratulations to Jacob Noyce (3rd Year) and David Kennedy (2nd Year), students at Banagher College on winning the Midlands Radio 3 Undercover 2016 Competition which

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was run on The Afternoon Show with Carl James. This competition was open to all secondary schools from Offaly, Westmeath and Laois. The boys' successful entry was a cover of 'Set Fire to the Rain' by Adele. As part of the prize, the students took to the Main Stage at 'Teen Aware' on Good Friday as well as claiming a day's recording session at the world famous Grouse Lodge Studios in Rosemount.

Rachel Reilly, a student at Oaklands Community College is one of the National Winners in the recent Mental Health Ireland Art Competition. Rachel's' picture will appear on the front cover and month of December page of the 2017 Mental Health Ireland calendar.

Further Education and Training Services

Quality Assurance/Learner Information Team

OETB has established a Quality Assurance (QA)/Learner Information Administrative team for all FET services. The team will manage and co-ordinate all QA activities, DES and SOLAS returns, statistical reports, TEL and further develop our PR (Social Media) strategy.

Services to Employers (Employer Engagement)

OETB FET Service is now working on a number of collaborative projects with local and national employers including:

Staff Training programmes for Bord Na Mona, Covidean and Elverys sports. Training programmes have been developed with CIF (Construction Industry Federation) for new entrants and existing employees.

The Hospitality Traineeship will conclude in early June, with all participating Hoteliers requesting a second course in September. Specific Skills Training for existing staff in two of the hotels will be delivered by LOETB in the coming weeks.

Currently, 125 employers in the region are actively engaging with LOETB through the Apprenticeship programme. Our intention is to meet each of these to discuss any other requirements they have and the services available to them through LOETB.

City & Guilds Agreement

LOETB and City & Guilds will sign a QA agreement in the Second Quarter of 2016. This will provide LOETB with access to a suite of Industry-focused skills courses and will provide a platform for the development of new industry-led programmes. A new 'Steel fixing' programme currently being developed for Mount Lucas is the first example of this process.

Training Services

LOETB took responsibility for all Training activities (Management, Delivery and Administration) in Laois and Offaly on 29 February. This amounts to an Annual budget of circa. €6 million and provides for Apprenticeship, Community, and Contracted Training and the National Construction Training Centre at Mount Lucas.

LOETB will develop an Integrated FET service. As part of this an internal Programme Review commenced in 2015. To date this strategic review has provided for new courses and programmes in Youthreach, VTOS, BTEI and PLC, and increased collaboration with a number of Third Level Institutes including CIT, AIT, LIT, NUIM and DIT.

Administrative Services

Capital

Despite many months of discussion no significant progress has been made to date on securing part/all the lands adjacent to the school site at Oaklands Community College. The Dept. of Education and Skills are currently assessing an alternative site and we await a report on its suitability presently.

Tullamore College is currently progressing well and the Contractor has given a tentative completion date of the end of June for Phase 1. The completion of the remaining section of roofing will impact on the likelihood of this completion date being achieved.

Tenders are currently being reviewed by Design Teams for works at Portlaoise Further Education Centre (renovation of hall and toilets), Portlaoise College (Ag. Science room). Tenders are also being reviewed for the upgrade of toilets at Portarlington FEC. Works on refurbishment of Edenderry Youthreach have completed and the windows have been replaced on the main building at Ard Scoil Chiarain Naofa, Clara.
