#### CHIEF EXECUTIVES REPORT:

# Schools

# School Patronage Application

DES has confirmed that they are continuing to analyse the application data for patronage of new schools and expect a report to go to the New Schools Evaluation Group in the coming weeks. The Group will then make a recommendation to the Minister of Education & Skills.

#### Exam Results

All schools reported excellent Leaving and Junior Certificate results and Portlaoise College featured on the RTE Six One News.

#### New Autism Unit

A second Autism Unit (Brosna Centre 2) has opened in Ard Scoil Chiaráin Naofa, Clara with capacity for 6 students.

# Career Exhibition Banagher College

Banagher College supported by LOETB are hosting their second Career & College Exhibition on Wednesday October 19th at 7pm in Banagher, Offaly. Universities, IT's, PLC and Agricultural Colleges will be in attendance. There will be information on further education, apprenticeships as well as The Defence Forces. Financial advice will be available as well as grant information from SUSI. All are welcome to this free event which was very successful last year.

## LOETB Pilot Project with Trinity College access 21

LOETB have finalised details of a pilot project with Trinity Access 21 which will see the College for Every Student (CFES) Programme being delivered in all eight schools. This programme supports students to proceed to third level through mentoring programmes, targeted skills development activities and career workshops.

Alongside this programme, in excess of 20 teachers from the schools will also participate in a Post Graduate Certificate in 21<sup>st</sup> Century Teaching and Learning. The two programmes offers a unique opportunity to support and raise student aspirations as well as further developing the quality of teaching and learning in schools. This is a very exciting opportunity as it is the first such pilot project with any ETB.

# Further Education and Training

# SOLAS Implementation Plan

The Strategic Expectations Initiative with SOLAS has progressed to the Implementation stage. Meetings with all staff are currently taking place to discuss inputs, outputs, and outcomes by programme/service. The Implementation plan includes regular monitoring (LOETB & SOLAS) with a full project evaluation in 2017.

#### Training

The Director of FET and Training team are developing a strategic plan for Mount Lucas National Construction Training Centre. This plan will focus on enhancing provision, further developing centre facilities and increasing the profile of the Centre. Meetings with stakeholders have commenced and will continue to year end.

## LOETB Formwork Programme

The LOETB / SOLAS / CIF Formwork programmes (2) commenced in August with 40 students. The students are currently getting ready for their first on-site work placement. Two additional programmes will commence in October and briefing sessions with potential participants are underway.

#### Staff Development

As part of LOETBs CPD Policy, the Director of FET has agreed a Managing People workshop for all FET Centre Managers / Directors with the IPA. This training will take place in early November.

# Capital

The refurbishment work in Portlaoise FET Centre commenced in September with a completion date of December 2016. The works include refurbishment of the Sports Hall, construction of additional Toilet facilities, and upgrading the Science Lab.

# Organisation Support and Development Services

#### Human Resources

Marie Bracken has been appointed as Director of Organisation Support & Development and Tony Dalton has been appointed as Director of Further Education & Training. We are finalising the appointment of a Director of Schools at present.

We processed in excess of 2,000 applications for posts during the summer months and the following appointments were made:

#### Corporate Services

Discussions are ongoing with the Landowner regarding acquiring lands in Edenderry for future use by Oaklands Community College.

Phase 1 of the Tullamore College development is due for completion at the end of October with full completion of the project set mid-March 2017.

#### Finance

The ESF Financial Control Unit have notified LOETB that they will audit the Adult Literacy programme 2012 and 2013. The audit will be conducted in October or November this year.

#### Procurement

A tender process was undertaken for Art and Music equipment for Oaklands Community College. Tara Art Supplies and Shaw Scientific were the successful companies.

A tender process was undertaken for course equipment in Mount Lucas. McMahon Building Providers was the successful company.

A tender process has been undertaken for the repair and service of plant and equipment in Mount Lucas. One tender was received and is being evaluated presently.

A tender process was undertaken for repairs to the heating system in Portlaoise Youthreach centre. Tenders are being evaluated at the moment.

A tender process was undertaken for the upgrade of toilets in Portarlington FEC. Michael Bracken was the successful contractor.
