Further Education and Training

Budget 2017

LOETB FET Service has been allocated €16.41m for 2017. This represents an increase of 7% on the funding received in 2016. The additional resources will be committed to the expansion of provision in Construction and the development of new evening/night provision for new entrants and employees.

Mount Lucas: National Construction Training Centre Strategic Plan

The process of developing a strategic plan for our centre at Mount Lucas has begun. The process is currently being driven by the FET Senior Management Team and will include a series of interviews and meetings with relevant stakeholders including SOLAS, City and Guilds, CIF, Offaly County Council, local employers and learners. A broader group of stakeholders will be invited to a Consultation meeting in Mount Lucas in March.

Provision 2017

Planning for provision in 2017 is complete. The FET service will focus on aligning services at QQI Levels 1-4 to provide appropriate progression pathways for learners at QQI Levels 5 and 6. Progression to Higher Education will continue to focus on STEM provision with the addition of Social Studies/Care in AIT from September. In terms of employment opportunities FET will continue to focus on provision in Construction, Healthcare, Services, Engineering, Retail and the MedTech sectors.

PLC Provision

In line with the strategic pilot project between SOLAS and LOETB, PLC provision in Offaly will be further centralised in September. QQI Level 6 Business Management, QQI Level 5 Applied Social Studies and QQI Level 5 Legal and Medical Admin will all be provided in Tullamore FETC.

Freedom of Information

A Freedom of Information request was answered in January 2017 and a further FOI request has been received and the reply is due by 9th March, 2017.

Data Protection

All Data Protection requests to date have been answered. 2 staff members to attend Data Protection training to prepare for the EU General Data Protection Regulation which will apply from 25 May 2018.

Capital

Discussions are on-going with a landowner regarding the proposed purchase of a site for Oaklands Community College in Edenderry. I met with DES officials this morning, along with Marie Bracken, to seek clarification on the terms and conditions of a proposed sale and await their response.

Finance

The Letter of Determination in respect of the year ending 31 December 2017 was received from the Department of Education and Skills on 16 February 2017. The ONP allocation is up 0.92% on the initial allocation for 2016, but is down 12.25% on the final allocation for 2016.

The DES will be engaging with ETBI in 2017 in relation to the development of standard templates for ETBs to use for Strategy Statements, Service Plans and Annual Reports.

Terms and Conditions of Funding received from SOLAS on 8 February 2017. The application of these Terms and Conditions commenced on 1 January 2017 and will continue until SOLAS decides, at its sole discretion, to replace, amend or terminate them.
