Clonaslee College

• CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning): Embedding Irish and improving the spoken language with the teaching of other subjects through Irish. Clonaslee College was chosen as one of the five schools nationwide for the CLIL Irish DES project. The Irish teachers will work with the NCCA, JCT and DES over the next three years to improve levels of spoken Irish. During their well-being classes the 1st year students will learn Céilí dancing for one hour a week for 6 weeks with TY students in April & May 2020. They will liaise with Dunamase College on the project and will host a grand Céilí Mór in May with all the 1st year students from both schools present

- Creative Engagement Project (NAPD & LOETB): TY students have worked with landscape architect Maeve O' Neill (won Award at Blooms garden festival) to create concept drawings for the central courtyard/garden area. Under the guidance of their Art teacher they are also working with a local sculptor to design bespoke furniture and ideas for an outdoor learning space
- Coding: The school has organised for local 5th class students to attend coding
 classes for 6 weeks in Feb/March 2020 with Darren from Raspberry Pi and
 Coding cluster groups. This is in preparation for the possible introduction of
 coding as a Short Course for the Junior Cycle. Next term a drama course for 6

Further Education and Training

FET Self Evaluation and External Review

LOETB met with QQI on 29 November to discuss the Self Evaluation and External Review process. The timeline for this process is approximately 10 months with the Self Evaluation process due to be completed on 30 May 2020. LOETB will now begin the process of assigning a project lead and establishing a steering group to oversee the process. The steering group will be chaired by the DFET and will include staff from across the organisation, external stakeholders such as employers and partner agencies and will also include learner input. The Self Evaluation process will involve consultation with a wide range of internal and external stakeholders to provide evidence of how effective our policies and procedures are in providing high quality teaching and learning.

FET Provision 2020

The FET Service is currently preparing the 2020 FET bid for SOLAS. In line with our Statement of Strategy and Strategic Performance Agreement, 2020 will see further growth in our Apprenticeship/Traineeship provision, Skills to Advance for employed learners, and an expansion of full and part time options for learners in all of our FET Centres. The bid will also include the development of *FET Information hubs in Portlaoise and Tullamore*. These will act as a central, accessible point of contact for current and perspective learners providing information, study and on-line facilities. The bid will also include a Capital project for Portlaoise Institute allowing us to double the provision on that site and significantly increase the opportunities for learners in Portlaoise.

FET Provision 2019

In 2019, the FET Service continued to grow. The addition of the Midland Skills Centre has provided the region with a state of the art Medtech/Bio-Pharma training facility and two additional electrical apprenticeships. Investment in Tullamore has been further enhanced with the development of an Engineering facility in Tullamore CTC.

The development of a new training facility at Mount Lucas National Construction Training Centre (to be completed in 2020) will provide significant opportunities for new Scaffolding apprentices. Other significant projects in 2019 include refurbishments in Clara FET Centre, Mountmellick FET Centre and Tullamore FET Centre.

FET Provision 2019 (Figures to End November 2019)

FET Professional Development 2019

- During 2019 Professional Development activities took place across the FET service for centre, support and delivery staff, and our senior management team.
- Centre administrators received training in the areas of communications, using social media, and MS Office applications including Excel to help streamline more efficient process for the OSD area.
- SharePoint sites have been developed for each FET centre, and our QA support service.
- A number of staff wellbeing events took place, including our 5/10K at Mount Lucas along with tailored workshops with two educational psychologists across Laois and Offaly for our delivery staff.
- A FET staff development day with four themed workshops and keynote speakers took place in the autumn to mark the start of a new academic year. Over 250 FET staff were in attendance.
- We held our first Technology Enhanced Learning event in November, focusing on a general theme of "Technology in Education." 38 staff members attended.
- A 5-part Leadership programme for FET forum members commenced in June of this year.

- Our link with IT Carlow continues with completion of 2 modules this year on the Masters programme. 34 colleagues participated.
- We had positive participation on the SOLAS pilot programmes in the areas of Change Management and TEL. Three FET colleagues completed the NUIG Change Management programme, while nine colleagues have joined the Level 6/7/8 TEL programmes over the course of this year.
- A CPD calendar for 2020 is now available to provide future development opportunities for all FET staff.

LOETB - Supporting Bord na Móna

Since its establishment, the Midlands Regional Transition Team has been working across four areas:

- Securing special status/designation for Offaly and the Midland Region & Funding Opportunities
- 2) Addressing the needs of those offered redundancy & Emerging Employment Opportunities
- 3) Emerging Property/Land Opportunities
- 4) Marketing the Region

LOETB has assumed the lead in addressing the needs of Bord Na Móna employees focussing on four key areas of work:

- Upskilling and reskilling those leaving Bord Na Móna and seeking employment elsewhere; CSCS - 47 participants upskilled (22 courses)/ EXPLORE IT Training-13 participants/ MIG
- TIG Welding 24 participants starting this week/ Industrial Electrical *2 18
 participants (Jan 2020)/ Programmable Logic Controllers 6 participants (Jan
 2020)/ Supervisory Management 12 participants (Jan 2020)
- Provision of community training and education for those leaving Bord Na Mona and not seeking employment elsewhere; exploring community-based, part-time programmes that enhance retiree's quality of life with a focus also on active citizenship and voluntary/community service
- Upskilling and reskilling those employees who choose to remain with Bord Na Móna; partnering Bord Na Mona in Employed Traineeships that focus on Enhanced Peatland Rehabilitation (and possibly Retrofitting) thereby enabling employees – BNM estimate 210 individual roles in peat rehabilitation alone retain their employment status for a minimum of four years.

Training to support sustainability of rural peatland communities; exploring employment opportunities in the region and providing training to match identified skills gaps e.g. New NZEB and Retrofit Training Facility at Mount Lucas, new Traineeship in Remote Working, Rural Enterprise Traineeship in Development.

A member asked the CE for an update on the site for Dunamase College. The CE confirmed that the contract for the school site is ready to be signed and we are seeking an additional 3 acres to the site for future use. We are currently awaiting a service level agreement from the DES before the appointment of a Design Team. The CE explained that the plan for Dunamase College in the interim is to extend into the buildings used by Portlaoise FET Centre in Tower Hill. Alternative accommodation will be sourced for our FET provision in the interim. A discussion took place on the lease and future use of Tower Hill.

A discussion took place on the roof repairs at Tullamore College. The CE explained that this refers to outstanding snags and remedial works and it is hoped that all works will be complete by the end of the school year.
