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Statement of Board Responsibilities

Laois and Offaly Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

Section 51 of that Act requires the ETB to keep in such form and in respect of such accounting periods as may be approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, all proper and usual accounts of the monies received or expended by it.

In preparing those accounts, the Board is required to:

- (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- (c) disclose and explain any material departures from the standard accounting policies

The Board is responsible for keeping proper books of account which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Board and which enable it to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with section 51 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. The Board is also responsible for safeguarding its assets and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Statement of System of Internal Control

Responsibility for the System of Internal Control

As provided for under the Education and Training Boards Act 2013, County Laois VEC and County Offaly VEC were dissolved on 30 June 2013 and all assets, liabilities and staff transferred to Laois and Offaly Education and Training Board (LOETB). The Board was formally established on 1 July 2013, constituted by former members of both County Laois and County Offaly VECs, and became responsible for reviewing and ensuring the effectiveness of the ETBs system of internal control. LOETB continued to apply the Code of Practice for the Governance of VECs as set out in Circular 11/05 until the new ETB Code of Practice was completed in March 2015. LOETB formally adopted the new code on 25 May 2015. The Audit and Finance Sub-Committees previously in place in the individual VECs were amalgamated and continued to operate until new Committees were formed following the local elections in June 2014 and the adoption of the new Code of Practice. These new Audit and Finance Committees were established in May 2015.

As Chairperson of LOETB, I acknowledge the responsibility of the Board for ensuring that an efficient, effective and economic system of internal control is maintained and operated. The purpose of such a system is to ensure that assets are safeguarded, transactions are authorised and properly recorded, and that material errors or irregularities are either prevented or would be detected in a timely period.

Key Control Procedures

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The Board has taken steps to ensure an appropriate control environment by:

- Adopting the Charter for Internal Audit at its meeting on 28 September 2015;
- Adopting a Code of Conduct for staff at its meeting on 23 November 2015;
- Adopting a Code of Conduct for Members at its meeting on 23 November 2015;
- Adopting a draft Risk Management policy at its meeting on 4 April 2016;
- Drawing up Terms of Reference for the Finance Committee;
- Drawing up Terms of Reference for the Audit Committee;
- Clearly defining management and staff responsibilities;
- Establishing procedures for reporting significant control failures and ensuring appropriate corrective action;
- Establishing procedures for identifying and evaluating all risks, which could prevent the ETB from achieving its objectives.

The system of internal control operated in LOETB is based on:

- Detailed administrative procedures;
- Segregation of duties;
- Specific authorisations;
- Internal check:
- Monthly management review of reports outlining the actual and budgeted results of programmes operated by the ETB.

Interim Governance arrangements which were in place during the eighteen month period and prior to the ETB Code of Practice for the Governance of ETBs being completed and adopted in 2015 were:

- Multi-disciplinary, cross-organisation teams were established to plan for, manage and oversee the merger of the VECs;
- Some policies and procedures from the former VECs have been updated and approved by LOETB and work is continuing in this area;
- LOETB continues to streamline work practices in the administrative area and between two offices;
- LOETB has compiled a Corporate Risk Register, which will be reviewed and monitored as per the timelines outlined in the Register. Risk Management is a listed agenda item for each Audit Committee meeting.

The Board's monitoring and review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control is informed by the:

- Work of the Audit Committee, which considers internal audit reports and reports of the Comptroller and Auditor General (C & AG), and reports to the board whether the Chief Executive is, in the internal auditor's opinion, operating adequate and appropriate systems of internal control;
- Chief Executive, who has responsibility for the financial control framework;
- Recommendations made by the C & AG in management letters or other reports.

During 2014 a control weakness resulted in a significant irregular payment in relation to supplier services. All of the monies were recovered in 2015. The controls and the relevant procedures have since been updated to address this issue.

An Internal Audit function is provided by the Internal Audit Unit – Education and Training Boards (IAU-ETB) The most recent Internal Audit was conducted in 2015 and covered Teacher Allocation and Co-operation Hours.

Annual Review of Controls

LOETB is committed to operating an efficient, effective and economic internal control system. Although the current Audit Committee was not set up until June 2015, the system was kept under review on an ongoing basis having access to minutes of Finance, Audit and Board meetings, and having regard to the findings of the most recent internal audits and comments made by the Comptroller and Auditor General in his management letters. A report on the internal controls in place in LOETB, covering computer systems, banking, payroll, purchasing and tendering, travelling expenses, receipts and general controls, was reviewed by the audit committee, and a report on same was issued to the Board. I confirm, therefore, that in the year ended 31 December 2015, the ETB conducted a review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control and found it to be satisfactory.

Comptroller and Auditor General Report for presentation to the Houses of the Oireachtas

Laois and Offaly Education and Training Board

I have audited the financial statements of Laois and Offaly Education and Training Board for the year ended 31 December 2015 under the Education and Training Boards Act 2013 (the Act). The financial statements, which have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein, comprise the statement of accounting policies, the operating account, the statement of current assets and current liabilities and the related notes. The financial reporting framework applied in their preparation is that prescribed by the Minister for Education and Skills under the Act.

Responsibilities of the Board

The Board is responsible for preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the Act and the accounting policies laid down by the Minister for Education and Skills. The Board is also responsible for ensuring the regularity of transactions.

Establishment of the Education and Training Board and the Accounting Policies of the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31st December 2015

1. Establishment of the Education and Training Board

Laois and Offaly Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013. County Laois and County Offaly Vocational Education Committees (VECs) were dissolved on 30 June 2013 and all assets, liabilities and staff of the VECs transferred to the ETB on a going concern basis. Details of the assets and liabilities transferred are set out in note 22 to these financial statements.

SOLAS was established on 27 October 2013 and all functions, operations, assets and liabilities remaining with FÁS, which was dissolved on 26 October 2013, transferred to SOLAS.

On 1 July 2014 the National Construction Training Centre building and contents in Mount Lucas, County Offaly, transferred to the ETB. Details of the associated assets transferred from SOLAS are set out in note 23 to these financial statements.

The functions of the ETB are set out in section 10 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements are presented in the form approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform. They consist of a Statement of Accounting Policies, an Operating Account, a Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities and notes to the financial statements.

(b) Basis of Preparation

The Operating Account presents Receipts and Payments by Programme Grouping and the resultant Cash Surplus / (Deficit) is adjusted for debtor and creditor movements to determine the overall result for the period on an accrual basis. The Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities is prepared on the accruals basis by determining state grant and other funder balances at amounts that reflect the related expenditure incurred and in accordance with the funding rules. Third Party Debtors are included in Current Assets. Pay and Expense Liabilities are included in Current Liabilities.

(c) Tangible Fixed Assets

All assets purchased including land and buildings, fixtures and fittings and training equipment are charged to expenditure in the year of purchase. State grants to fund the purchase of tangible fixed assets are taken to income in the same year.

(d) Stocks

consumable stocks are charged to expenditure when purchased.

(e) Superannuation

The pension entitlements of ETB staff, including those who transferred from SOLAS, are conferred under defined benefits schemes.

Superannuation deductions made from employees pay in respect of the schemes are retained by the ETB as part of agreed Exchequer funding, or paid over to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

The ETB does not make any contributions towards the schemes.

These unfunded schemes are operated on a pay as you go basis with the annual pension entitlements being paid directly by the Department of Education and Skills.

(f) Lease Rentals

All lease rentals are expensed as incurred.
